

Health and Social Care

For students looking to pursue a career in Health and Social Care, or to use it as a stepping stone to the BTEC Level 3 or A level in Health and Social Care course, the GCSE is an excellent choice.

You will learn about the different physical, intellectual, social and emotional needs individuals have and how these needs can be met; how to communicate with a wide variety of people from all cultures and backgrounds. The course will also allow the students to learn about the anatomy and physiology of how the body works.

Course Content

Understanding personal development, relationships and exploring health, social care and early year's provision.

- Actively engage in the processes of health and social care in order to develop as effective and independent students;
- Understand aspects of personal development, within the health, social care and early years sectors, through investigation and evaluation of a range of services and organisations;
- Develop a critical and analytical approach to problem solving within the health, social care and early years sectors; and
- Examine issues which affect the nature and quality of human life, including an appreciation of diversity and cultural issues.

Examples of Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Education in Health and Social Care include:

- Students have the opportunity to study cultural factors that affect development
- Students have the opportunity to study what is meant by a diverse culture, and the meeting of needs of different cultures
- Students have the opportunity to study how different factors of life experiences affect development
- Students have the opportunity to study how different social, emotional physical and intellectual factors affect development in the different life stages

Assessment

Each student will have to complete a piece of coursework through controlled assessment which equates to 60% of their final grade, with the remaining 40% of the course being assessed through a written examination at the end of the two year course.
